MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Subj: MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR COORDINATION AND
COMMUNICATION

1. Purpose. This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is entered into by and between Commander Navy Region Mid-Atlantic, Naval Support Activity (NSA) Crane, the White River Military Coordination Alliance (“Alliance”), Greene County, Lawrence County, Martin County, Daviess County, Sullivan County, the City of Sullivan and the Town of Crane (collectively referred to as the “Parties”) for the purpose of ensuring community growth that is compatible with and/or supports the military missions of NSA Crane and establishing effective and timely means of communication between the Parties to coordinate and address mutual concerns and issues.

2. Points of Contact

a. For purposes of coordination among the Parties, the Alliance will maintain a list of designated “Points of Contact” for each Party. These officials will ensure the provisions of the MOA are met as to the commitments of their organization, and, when the involvement of others within their organization is useful, will coordinate with those persons as needed.

b. A Party may change its point of contact or contact information at any time by providing written notice to the Secretary of the Alliance.

3. Commitments of the Parties. Within three (3) months of entering the MOA, the Parties agree to begin or continue implementation of the following ongoing coordination commitments:

a. All Parties

(1) Duties

(a) The Parties will discuss any land use applications, changes or trends anticipated within the Coordination Military Compatibility Area that could impact the use and enjoyment of lands or that could negatively impact operations at NSA Crane.

(b) The Parties will monitor land use trends within the Coordination Military Compatibility Area and advise the other Parties to this MOA if additional actions, policies, strategies, outreach materials, or other steps are needed to maintain land use compatibility within the Coordination Military Compatibility Area.

(2) Meetings

(a) The Alliance will hold at least one meeting annually, but the Parties shall meet as often as necessary for the purpose of transacting the business at hand. The Alliance Chair shall call the meeting and shall designate in the written notice of the meeting and the business to be transacted or considered. Regular meetings shall be held on the (ex. Third Monday of a month at 1:30 p.m.), or as designated by the Alliance, and will be hosted on a rotating basis by the Alliance members.

(b) At least once per year the Parties via the Alliance should provide briefings to NSA Crane/Lake Glendora Test Facility leadership of changes within the Local Government Parties' communities that may impact the installation including comprehensive plans, master plans, transportation plans, zoning, development projects, and capital improvement plans.

(c). At least once per year Parties via the Alliance, on behalf of the communities, will request NSA Crane installation leadership present a State of the Installation briefing including strategic goals, operational changes, and construction projects that may impact the Local Government Parties' communities.

b. NSA Crane

(1) Increased Military Impact Notifications

(a) NSA Crane will give Notice to the other points of contact for each of the Parties to this MOA of known Increased Military Impacts. Written Notice will include:

1. A description of the nature of the anticipated Increased Military Impacts;
2. The anticipated date the Increased Military Impacts will begin and, if temporary in nature, the anticipated date of their termination;
3. If available and subject to public review, a map showing any documented off-posts impacts anticipated to result from the Increased Military Impacts;
4. A means and timeframe within which to provide comments to NSA Crane, as applicable, with respect to any potential impacts on a Party resulting from anticipated Increased Military Impacts; and

5. Any other information NSA Crane deems relevant to the other Parties' consideration of the anticipated Increased Military Impacts and interests.

(2) Community Event Calendar. NSA Crane Points of Contact may regularly submit planned public events such as speaking engagements and STEM programming to a Community Event Calendar that will be hosted on the Alliance Website.

c. The Alliance

(1) Increased Military Impact Notifications. The Alliance will ensure that any public notice of Increased Military Impact is published to the Alliance Website and Alliance social media.

(2) Community Event Calendar. The Alliance will create and host a shared Community Event Calendar on the Alliance Website where the Parties may submit public events that would increase stronger Crane-community collaboration, build installation-community relationships, and provide personal touchpoint opportunities between Crane and the community.

d. Local Government Parties

(1) Capital Improvement Projects

(a) The Local Government Parties will provide notice to NSA Crane whenever their respective legislative body considers construction of capital improvement projects located within the Coordination Military Compatibility Area.

(b) For purposes of this MOA, infrastructure means construction of buildings, structures, roads, new road capacity, and the extension of sanitary sewer or water lines within the Coordination Military Compatibility Area.

(c) The Local Government Parties will consider the input of other Parties and NSA Crane, when provided, prior to any final decisions related to the construction of capital improvement projects within the Military Compatibility Area.

(2) Potential Incompatible Developments. The Local Government Parties will notify NSA Crane as to any Potential Incompatible Developments proposed within the Coordination Military Compatibility Area, of which they are aware, whether or not official action by a Local Government Party is required.

(3) Community Event Calendar. Points of Contact will regularly submit planned public events such as festivals, parades, and government meetings where an NSA Crane presence would increase stronger Crane-community collaboration, build installation-community relationships, and provide personal touchpoint opportunities between Crane and the community to a Community Event Calendar that will be hosted on the Alliance Website.

e. Alliance Website

(1) Establishment

(a) The Parties will assist in the maintenance of the Alliance Website.

(b) The Alliance Website will be hosted and updated by the Alliance.

(2) Content

(a) The Alliance Website will provide information pertaining to the Parties, including contact information for its Points of Contact for the purpose of making designated officials available to citizens with questions related to land use within the Military Compatibility Area, Increased Military Impact Notifications, or, at the request of and subject to approval by NSA Crane, related to operations and training at NSA Crane.

(b) The Alliance Website will provide access to the following documents for use by the public:

1. The 2017 JLUS;

2. A copy of this MOA

(c) The Alliance Website will provide information concerning land conservation incentives and easement acquisition opportunities through a GIS-based Conservation Incentive Toolkit.

(d) The Alliance Website will provide any other information deemed relevant by the Parties.

4. Miscellaneous

a. Nature of the MOA. This MOA reflects a commitment of the Parties to maintain a dialogue on land use activities in the vicinity of NSA Crane in a formalized manner. The Parties recognize the MOA is not legally-binding and cannot be enforced by court action; however, each Party intends to pursue its obligations in good faith.

b. Review

(1) If deemed advisable by the Military Community Planning Liaison or a Party to the MOA, the Parties' Points of Contact will review and make recommendations for modifications to the MOA.

(2) Review by the Parties should consider, in addition to any other related matters:

(a) The need for additional encroachment protections if development trends change or intensify in the vicinity of NSA Crane;

(b) The need for additional specifications to Increased Military Impact Notifications

(c) Clarification of administrative procedures;

(d) Addressing significant changes in NSA Crane missions, or to pursue mitigation funding if or when it becomes available;

(e) The need for additional studies; and

(f) The need to invite additional Parties to join the MOA.

c. Modification. Modifications to the MOA, including the addition of new Parties, shall be valid only when reduced to writing and duly signed by all Parties.

d. Withdrawal

(1) After the Effective Date, any Party may withdraw from participation in the MOA, without the consent of the other Parties.

(2) A Party's withdrawal will be effective upon receipt of Written Notice by all remaining Parties to the MOA.

(3) Following a Party's withdrawal, all obligations of the withdrawing Party as stated in the MOA shall cease, as shall all obligations of the remaining Parties to the withdrawing Party.

(4) Withdrawal of a Party does not terminate the agreements of the remaining Parties to the terms of the MOA.

(5) Upon withdrawal of a Party, the remaining Parties will execute an amended MOA in order to reflect the withdrawn Party.

e. Duration. Unless the MOA is terminated by all Parties, the term of the MOA is two (2) years from the Effective Date. The MOA will automatically renew for a new two (2) year term, up to a maximum of eight (8) years, unless a majority of the Parties elect to terminate the MOA or to disallow its renewal.

f. Effective Date. This MOA is effective upon execution by all Parties, IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have executed this MOA on the dates below written.
